Curriculum News

Our topic are 'Maya Civilisation' and 'USA'.

This term in History, children will learn about the Maya Civilisation, exploring who the Maya people were, where and when they lived, and what made their society so advanced, before comparing this with learning about the USA, including key geographical features and aspects of its history and culture.

Reading and Writing

In reading, the children are continuing to read Harry Potter and will then move onto How to Train Your Dragon.

Maths

This term, the children will learn about decimals, money, time and statistics. We will continue to have a strong focus on times tables in preparation for the MTC in June.

Science
